Report 1: Presentation on The Education System

April 2000

INTRODUCTION

Three technical staff from Puskur were sponsored by the Curriculum Capacity Project to undertake a study tour to Australia. The purpose was to develop a better understanding and obtain ideas on the education system in Australia. The information gathered would be used as a reference in developing the new curriculum in Indonesia. The territory of ACT (Canberra) and two states were visited, namely Queensland and New South Wales. The study tour lasted for one week, from 11-16 March 2000.

The CCP project organized a two-day seminar-workshop as one of the follow up activities to this study tour. The objective of the workshop was to share ideas and experiences about the education system in different countries, particularly looking at the structure, role and function of the countries' equivalent to MONE's *Balitbang* here in Indonesia. One of the returnees presented information on Australia at the workshop. As Australia has a state education system rather than a national one, Queensland was used as the example for the presentation at the workshop. That material is included here as this report.

The workshop was conducted in the Curriculum Development Centre, Jakarta, 30-31 March, 2000. The participants consisted of the heads of divisions and staff of the Curriculum Development Centre.

A second report disseminating information from the study tour is available under a separate cover and contains the material presented at a seminar on "New Basics" by another of the returnees.

The study tour participants and the Curriculum Development Centre would like to thank DfID and the British Council for their assistance and support in making the study tour happen.


NATIONAL GOVERNMENT IN CANBERRA, ACT with Prime Minister and Ministers






